
The T-Puzzle Exercise


Directions:


- 1. There will be a "client" and "consultant" in each group; the others will act as observers.
- 2. The client and consultant are to sit back-to-back
- 3. Half of the observers are to position themselves in order to view the client, and the other half to view the consultant.
- 4. When given the signal, the client and consultant are to open their envelopes and take out the puzzle pieces.
- 5. The consultant is then to instruct the client how to arrange his/her puzzle pieces to form a symmetrical "T." (The consultant will have a diagram indicating how the pieces are to be arranged.)
- 6. The client and consultant may not look at each other, or each other's puzzle pieces, nor may any questions be asked. Only one-way communication is permitted.
- 7. When the second signal is given, two-way communication may begin (i.e., questions and answers are permitted).
- 8. Observers' role: You must be careful not to coach, giggle, etc. while taking notes during the process.
- 9. At the completion of the process, the group should discuss what happened. Start with the observers views, then move on the to consultant and client.




Cut the T out of different colors (mix sets...the client and consultant should not have the same color pieces) -

second page is puzzle pieces to be duplicated and cut
