

Green Goals




Each month, MASC's Environmental Affairs Coordinators challenge people to take part in their green goals, positively impacting the environment.

This month's green goals are: - Avoid throwing your pumpkins away in the trash. They create harmful methane waste in landfills. Instead, compost them or break them open and have wildlife eat them. Many areas have sites available for residents to drop off food waste, such as MOM's Market and local government buildings, which can be found with a simple Google search!

-Avoid excessive buying. Do you need all those new sweaters, or can you wear some from last year? Is that spooky fashion wear something you'll keep for a couple of years or throw away right after Halloween is over?

Remembering Nora Murray



April 15, 1964 – September 13, 2022

It is with heavy hearts that MASC announces the passing of an incredible spirit and advisor within MASC. After a 14-year battle with sarcoma, during the early morning on Wednesday, September 13, 2022, our beloved Nora Murray passed away. It was through her promotion of student leadership and civic engagement that she helped students find their voice in life, school, and the world.

Mrs. Murray was the former Carroll and Baltimore County regional advisor as well as the last fulltime MASC Executive Director.
