# Legislative Session Info

On Saturday, February 11, 2023, MASC's annual Legislative Session will take place at Wheaton High School in Montgomery County. The Legislative Session Conference is where students across Maryland vote for their top two finalists for the state Student Member of the Board of Education (SMOB). Students select two candidates to move forward for the governor to appoint the next SMOB. The conference also includes workshops centered around the legislative process and general sessions where delegates take stances on youth-related bills in the General Assembly. Registration is now open for MASC member schools only and will close at 11:59 p.m, Wednesday January 25th. School advisors administrators MUST register students for this conference through the link on the MASC Legislative Session web page.


