MASC Health Room Procedures



On-site advisors will hold and administer any prescribed medications that students need. It is expected that the on-site advisor will have their school system's form for bringing and safely storing medications on a field trip.

MASC has a certified nurse on duty during the entire event. Students should let their on-site advisor know if they are going to the health room. The nurse is available to handle on-stie urgent care.



COVID Procedures

MASC is following CDC and Maryland Department of Health Guidelines for our events.

If participants experience COVID <u>symptoms</u> prior to a MASC event, they should stay home. Testing is recommended for people with symptoms of COVID-19 as soon as possible after symptoms begin. Staying home when sick can lower the risk of spreading infectious diseases, including COVID-19, to other people.

If a student/advisor is experiencing symptoms, they can see the nurse to take a Rapid test. If a student tests positive, the nurse will notify the advisor and executive director and that child will be placed in a separate room for isolation until the child's parents can come and take them home.

If someone tests positive, students who have been around that student need to wear a mask (N95 mask from the nurse) and start testing in five days.
