Dear Maryland Student Leaders and Advisors,

To kick off the 2025-2026 school year, the Maryland Association of Student Councils (MASC) will host its first major in-person conference of the year, the **Fall Leadership Conference (FLC)**, highlighting our “S.G.Agents” theme. The conference is on **Saturday, November 22, 2025, at Northwest High School in Montgomery County**. Secondary students from across the state will attend multiple workshops, activities, and general sessions. Through attending, students will have the opportunity to develop and hone invaluable leadership skills that they can bring back to their schools and counties, while also meeting many other student leaders across Maryland.

The middle school component of FLC is designed to help emerging student leaders discover their strengths and unlock their potential to serve, inspire, and lead. During the conference, delegates will take part in three interactive workshops—**Parliamentary Procedure** (a middle school-friendly review), **Agents of Influence**, and **Mission MINUTE**. In addition, students will participate in a **mock general assembly**, where they’ll practice introducing legislation, debating, and voting. They’ll also have opportunities to **share ideas** about their own student councils’ projects and **connect with peers** from across the state through engaging “Get to Know You” activities.

The high school portion varies slightly from the middle school portion of FLC. High school delegates will first hear from Mr. Jeffrey LaPorta, the Executive Director of the Association of School Business Officials of Maryland, which provides programs and services to promote the highest standards of school business practices in Maryland. Delegates will then experience a series of three interactive workshops designed by their peers specifically for Maryland’s high school leaders. Workshop topics change from year to year and are based on ideas submitted by high school students around the state and MASC alumni. Previous topics have included advocacy, diversity, school spirit, community service, environmental awareness, and other unique topics that workshop presenters wish to share with our students. High school delegates will also get the chance to participate in MASC’s Mission Briefings, which allow students to learn and participate in various activities that they can bring directly back to their schools. These action-packed 30-minute sessions have topics ranging from MASC’s award opportunities to hosting service projects and fundraisers. Finally, they will engage with fellow students in round table discussions centered around Maryland’s Blueprint and the Accountability and Implementation Board (AIB).

Something that is unique to MASC is that most workshops are written and facilitated **for the students, by the students**. We believe that peer-to-peer teaching is a great technique used in student leadership that allows everyone involved to make the most of their experience at FLC and MASC’s other conferences. Throughout the day, delegates and advisors may network with hundreds of other student leaders from across the state.

To cover the expense of conference materials and contracts, facilities, food for the attendees, the registration fee is \$30 per delegate and advisor (\$25 for selected workshop presenters – information will be sent to school advisors).
